Linwood Charitable Trust is dedicated to raising money for the School. We are parents, staff and friends of the School who want to further enhance the education and wellbeing of our children and young people, their families and the wider community.

The Charitable Trust Committee meets at least once every term and holds the AGM during the Autumn Term. The Committee considers the fundraising and donations received and reports on balances of account and agreed purchases made on behalf of the Trust. A copy of the audited accounts are sent to the Charities Commission annually which will also be reported to the Governing Board and are available to view on the school website.

Our aim is to support the school, by providing resources, specialist equipment, support for extra-curricular activities and the development of the learning environment. New members are welcome throughout the year.

LINWOOD SCHOOL INFORMATION

Linwood School currently has six campuses:

- Linwood Campus provides for pupils aged 3-19 with a comprehensive range of SEND and complex needs.
- Post 19 Link+ (at Linwood Campus) supports young adults with additional learning needs transitioning to adulthood for up to 5 students aged 19 to 25.
- Springwood Campus provides for pupils aged 3-19 with a diagnosis of Autism, some of whom have severe learning difficulties and complex needs.
- Littlewood Campus provides for pupils aged 3-6 with a diagnosis of Autism, some of whom have severe learning difficulties and complex needs.
- Woodford Campus provides for pupils aged 7 to 11 with a range of special educational needs, based at Twynham Primary School.
- Summerwood Campus supports students aged 16-19 who have a diagnosis of Autism working at age related expectations.
- CHI (Classroom in the Heart of the Industry) provides employment and education training for students aged 16-19 with moderate learning difficulties.
