For operational reasons it may be necessary to alter a recipe at short notice and therefore **your child or the member of school staff who presents your child at the counter must check each time before being served with the food**
- The Company handles many of the 14 common food allergens in our busy kitchens and so therefore cannot guarantee that our food is 100% free from specific food allergens
- There are foods not on the list of 14 common food allergens which can cause allergic reactions in a small number of people and if your child has such an allergy, **they or school member must check each time before being served with the food.**

Our allergen process is written to protect the welfare of the children.
